Who has a new HD Smart TV on their Christmas list?

For those of you who have a new HD TV or HD Smart TV on your Christmas list, hooking them up may be a little daunting. Below is a diagram that helps explain what each port on the back of your new tv is used for. In a bind, a great tool to use when setting up new devices is Google.

Keep in mind that your new TV, Blu Ray player or HDMI devices will not come with HDMI cords so

DON'T FORGET TO BUY HDMI CORDS!



#1—HDMI ports: these are used to connect cable boxes, blu ray players, gaming devices, etc. Notice there is a 1 and 2 above each HDMI port. Whatever port (1 or 2) that you plug your device in to will be the input you chose on your tv. For example, if your cable box is in port 1 and your blu ray is in port 2 and you want to watch cable, you need to change your tv input to HDMI1.

#2—Aux ports: These red, white and yellow ports are used to plug in your non High Def devices such as old VCR players.

#3—PC In port: You can use this port to hook your computer up and use your tv as your computer screen.

#4—USB port: This is for a flash drive and will allow you to view the items on your flash drive such as pictures.

#5—Digital Audio Out port: Use this port to hook up sound bars.

Once everything is connected, if you have a smart tv, as you are going through the settings you will be asked to enter your wireless (router) password. If you can't remember your wireless password look for a sticker on the side of your router.

Most times the manufacturer will put it there.

Latest Ransomware attack—BAD RABBIT

The latest ransomware attack has been dubbed Bad Rabbit. Your computer can become infected when you visit websites infected with this ransomware code. The code prompts you to download an Adobe Flash Player Update. IF YOU SEE SUCH A PROMPT, DO NO CLICK THE INSTALL BUTTON. Infected computers will most likely lose access to files. This ransomware is particularly nasty as the install prompt looks very legitimate. If your Adobe needs to be updated, go directly to Adobe's website.

Always be wary of installing software based on website prompts. It's a good idea to ensure your computer's software and operating system is always up-to-date, use good virus protection program and ALWAYS back-up your files.
